**Welcome**-Opening Prayer: Act 2:42-47

To prepare for Monday's Meeting, Pastoral Council members were asked to read Chapters 9 and 10 of the book: *Rebuilt. The following is adapted from Rebuilt, pages 105-113*

Discipleship is all about simple steps. As spiritual leaders, we are to shape the path of discipleship for the people in our pews and set up environments and opportunities so followers of Christ move together in the same direction. Scripture and Tradition outline five major steps to clearly and consistently challenge people on the discipleship path. Any time we ask our parishioners to do anything, the challenges are, in some way, a reflection of these steps. In each, there is a synergy between how followers grow and how the church grows.

To illustrate the discipleship path, rely on the acronym S.T.E.P.S.

- S: SERVE IN A MINISTRY OR MISSION
  - Service is absolutely essential to growth as a follower of Jesus Christ. As a church, if we are to make an impact on our community and world, we need people who are committed to giving their time in service. We challenge the people in our pews to serve in ministry, which means serving at the parish and/or serving in missions.
- T: TITHE OR GIVE
  - The Church needs financial resources to function. Ministry costs money. Tithing challenges parishioners to look at all of their finances as belonging to God and to trust him. People need to give in their place of worship as an act of worship.
- E: ENGAGE IN A SMALL GROUP
  - We need friends in faith to grow closer to Jesus Christ. Small groups are where we provide pastoral care for our members and where our great church gets small. There, they can share their faith, learn from others' life experience, receive support, and help carry other's burdens.
- P: PRACTICE PRAYER; CELEBRATE THE SACRAMENTS
  - Prayer and the celebration of the sacraments help us grow in our love for God. Without them our souls can go malnourished. We invite parishioners to choose a time and place for personal prayer, helping them develop healthy habits such as scripture reading, eucharistic adoration, and the Rosary. We especially want to help parishioners find a full and active participation in the Eucharist.
- S: SHARE YOUR FAITH THROUGH EVANGELIZATION
  - Jesus told the apostles to go and make disciples. He sent them out into the world to lead people who are unconnected to God into a relationship with him. Faith grows when it is shared.

    - will consider seating capacity and availability of ministers
- Holy Week Schedule (2019)
  - Vigil-one Mass 2 1/2 hours, needs to start at 7:30-8:00 p.m.-baptisms must occur at the Vigil Mass, confirmations can occur at any Easter Mass, Easter Vigil Mass is not the most attended
  - Easter Sunday-two Masses will be offered
    - will consider seating capacity of the churches, persons to be baptized, and availability of ministers
  - Holy Thursday and Good Friday celebrations will be held at the same location
  - Fr. Mark will make the decision and publish those times
- Bishop's Response to Letters sent to him concerning our proposals for Tri-Parish Sunday were shared with Council members and discussed. The Mass schedule changes will be delayed (therefore will remain as is) until after the Diocesan Personnel Board meets again. It is anticipated that a decision could be made during the summer months and a new schedule could begin in early Fall.
