Respect Life Corner: November is Palliative and Hospice Care Month. The Catholic Church supports palliative and hospice care in the face of growing legalization of euthanasia and assisted suicide around the world. What are these terms?

Palliative Care: Relieves the pain of a serious illness while working with primary, curative care.

Hospice Care: Focuses on the pain, symptoms, and stress of a serious illness during its terminal phase.

Euthanasia: One person intentionally acts to end the life of another person who is deemed to be suffering.

Physician Assisted Suicide: A doctor assists the patient in acquiring the means to commit suicide.

What does the Catholic Church support?

CCC 2276: Those whose lives are diminished or weakened deserve special respect. Sick or handicapped persons should be helped to lead lives as normal as possible.

CCC 2277: Whatever its motives and means, direct euthanasia consists in putting an end to the lives of handicapped, sick, or dying persons. It is morally unacceptable.

CCC 2279: Even if death is thought to be imminent, the ordinary care owed to a sick person cannot be legitimately interrupted ... Palliative care is a special form of disinterested charity. As such it should be encouraged
