The Epiphany

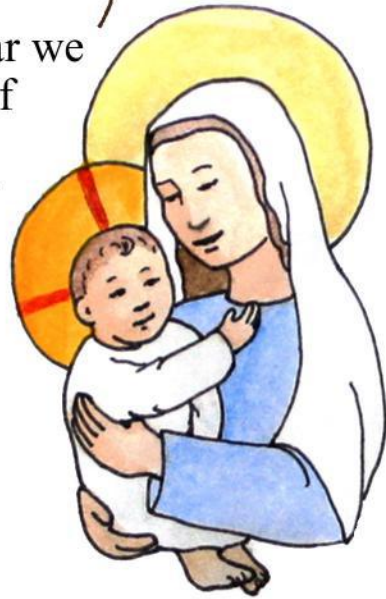
At the beginning of the new year we celebrate both Mary, the Mother of God and the Epiphany, which is when the wise men came from far away to worship baby Jesus.

Can you thank Mary today for bringing Jesus to us?

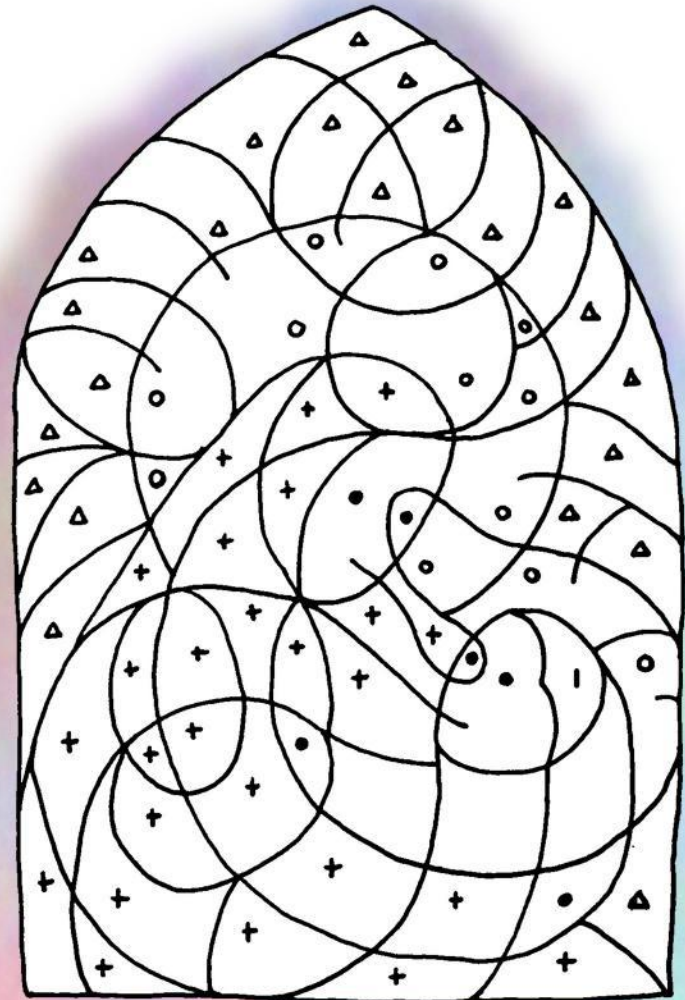
